Request for Proposals (RFP)

- The federal Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) for [AmeriCorps State and National Grants FY 2019](#) has been released by the Corporation for National and Community Service (CNCS)
- State service commissions, like Serve Kentucky, have their own RFP and training/technical assistance schedule.
- Single state applicants should not contact CNCS directly.



Programs start by Sept. 1

- Sept. • CNCS releases AmeriCorps NOFO
- Oct. • ServeKY releases AmeriCorps RFP
- Nov. • Applicants submit Intent to Apply and other required documentation
- TTA calls/webinars
- Applicants submit grants to ServeKY
- ServeKY staff review/clarifications

- June • Approved **formula** applications returned to applicants for revisions
- July • Revised applications submitted to ServeKY
- Aug. • ServeKY submits final applications to CNCS
- Apply for **formula** supplemental funds, if available (July-August)

- Dec. • Grant Review of applications requesting **Competitive** funding
- ServeKY Program Committee develops recommendations and ranks applications
- Recommendations presented to ServeKY Commission for vote
- Applicants notified of Commission decisions

- June • Grant Review of applications requesting **Formula** funding
- ServeKY Progra Committee develops funding allocation recommendations
- Recommendations presented to ServeKY Commission for vote
- Applicants notified of Commission decisions

- May • CNCS announces **competitive** grant awards
- June • CNCS releases **Formula** funding allocations for KY
- ServeKY releases AmeriCorps **Formula** RFP
- Applicants submit grants to ServeKY

- Dec. • Approved **competitive** applications returned to applicants for revisions
- Jan. • Revised applications submitted to ServeKY
- ServeKY submits final applications to CNCS



FY19 KY Competitive RFP Timeline

- **October 16, 2018:** Kentucky Competitive Grant RFP released
- **October 30, 2018:** [Intent to Apply](#) deadline
- **November 30, 2018:** Competitive grant applications due in [eGrants](#)
- **January 4, 2019:** Applicants notified, applications returned for revisions
- **January 16, 2019:** Revised grant applications due in eGrants
- **April 1, 2019:** Notification of competition results (Applications not approved for competitive submission may apply for formula funding in Spring 2019.)

Please Note: The dates referenced in the NOFO materials are for national direct applicants (operating in multiple states) and state commissions only.



Summary of Significant Changes for FY19

- Eliminating the requirement that programs must have at least 20 AmeriCorps members to apply competitively.
- Reducing the number of funding priorities from 10 to 7 and including 13 education evidence-based interventions and adding faith-based organizations. See the [Mandatory Supplemental Guidance](#) for more information.
- Decreasing the narrative requirement from 12 pages to 10 pages, and decreasing what CNCS is requesting from applicants.



Summary of Significant Changes for FY19

- Increasing the **minimum living allowance** by \$260 for a full-time member which makes it **\$13,992**.
 - That resulted in an increased **cost per MSY to \$15,192**.
 - This was mandatory due to an increase in the VISTA sustenance allowance.
 - Serve Kentucky strongly encourages living allowances above the minimum in anticipation of annual increase to the minimum.
- Eliminating the narrative about “need” as it is already requested in the Theory of Change and Logic Model section of the application.



Summary of Significant Changes for FY19

- Streamlining the evidence section and requirements by:
 - Removing a complicated matrix and scoring the evidence tier and the degree to which data supports the proposed program.
 - Eliminating “no evidence” as a category.
 - Streamlining the definitions for pre-preliminary, preliminary, and moderate evidence per feedback from the field.
 - Eliminating the “learning memo” for re-competing applicants in an effort to streamline our requirements of applicants per feedback from the field.



Summary of Significant Changes for FY19

- Requesting that programs add \$54 plus the cost of the state check for each covered position (members and staff) to the CNCS share for criminal history checks.
 - While it is a requirement to build the cost of NSCHC into the budget, it is not a requirement for 2019 to use Fieldprint and/or Truescreen.
 - While it is a requirement to build it into the budget, it is not a requirement for 2019 to use Fieldprint and/or Truescreen.
 - CNCS strongly encouraged grantees to use Fieldprint and Truescreen, and the \$54+ in the NOFO corresponds with those costs.



Summary of Significant Changes for FY19

- State Commissions can opt to take up to 2% of administrative costs on fixed price grants (previously only an option for cost reimbursement).
 - Serve Kentucky will require 2% for all applicants.
- The cost per MSY for cost reimbursement and full-time fixed price grants is the same: \$15,192 (previously lower for fixed grants).



Summary of Significant Changes for FY19

- Continuation applicants **may** apply for expansions – dollars, MSY, and/or members.
- The 1,200 hour (three-quarter-time) member position is included.
- Reduced and streamlined performance measures (from 98 pages to 32 pages).



Converting to Fixed Amount Grants

- If you are in year two or three of a cost reimbursement grant cycle, you need to submit a **new application** to participate in the fixed amount grant.
- You cannot continue your existing project period and switch from cost reimbursement to fixed amount.
 - You must contact Serve Kentucky to be able to enter a new project in eGrants.
- Serve Kentucky/CNCS reserves the right to consider your continuation request if your fixed amount application is not funded.
